atricia "Trish" Rawson says that when she first met her husband of just a little over 50 years, he was "a shrinking violet." Now, Art Rawson is the kind of guy that everyone knows. When he helps Rock Creek Knights of Columbus sell raffle tickets outside St. Jane's, he makes sure that everybody rushing out at least takes a look. He is noted for moving newspapers closer to front doors on early morning walks, for his Hawaiian shirts and the various pins he always sports on his lapel. Even the U.S. President has noticed these pins, twice. In addition to his church and K. of C. activities, Art has been active in garden clubs and since his Roanoke, Virginia, youth, the Boy Scouts. In fact, for his service to Scouting, he received the St. George Medal from Bishop Corrada in 1995. Trish sang in the St. Jane's Choir for many of the 32 years the Rawson family has lived in the parish.

Take one look at Art and you'll say, "This guy was a sea captain!" and indeed he was, not only a sea captain but a U.S. Navy submarine captain for half of his Navy career, one of his commands being The USS Conger. Art's favorite expression-philosophy of life if you will, is an underwater counterpart of "steady as she goes": Keep a zero bubble! Art met Trish O'Toole - born on St. Patrick's Day into a large Chicago

Now, when most senior couples would be looking for smaller quarters, the Rawsons just added a large, airy room to their house called "the teapot room" wherein is housed Trish's collection of teapots, some 60.

Fifty years of marriage have brought the Rawsons six children and sixteen grandchildren, soon to be eighteen as youngest daughter, Lee Carol is expecting twins. Two, Patricia and Kevin, have had Navy careers themselves and a grandson is applying to the Naval Academy for entry in 1997. Margaret and Catherine live in Pittsburgh and Ossining, New York respectively. The oldest son, Art, lives in Derwood.

With children and grandchildren living all around the country, Art and Trish figured that the best way to celebrate their golden anniversary would be to gather the whole family in Norfolk, Virginia so that the widely scattered grandchildren could get to know each other better.
